WHEREAS the Cordry Sweetwater Conservancy District Board of Directors and LERKEROWN CIRCUIT COURT thereof are obligated to protect their investments and interests and wish to preserve the quality environment and aesthetic values inherent to the Conservancy:

AND WHEREAS the Office of Economic Development (EOA) has designated Camp Atterbury for a Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) to better understand the impact of Atterbury becoming a permanent training and mobilization camp. The Cordry Sweetwater Conservancy District is the largest residential community of 1700 homes in Brown County and is located contiguous to Camp Atterbury. With Atterbury's new designation there is an increased opportunity for noise, ecological wildlife, and economic impact to the Cordry Sweetwater Conservancy District. Many of these issues are unique to the Conservancy due to the size of the conservancy and its proximity to the base and can not be properly addressed by the Brown County governmental staff.

**THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Board of Directors of the Cordry Sweetwater Conservancy District request that a member representing the Conservancy serve on the Policy committee of the Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) and on any permanent advisory board or committee institutionalized to serve as a monitoring agent for the study. The Conservancy will make information available to the Conservancy Lot Owners through updates at meetings. The final JLUS report will be presented to the Board of Directors of the Conservancy for adoption and the final report will be available at the CSCD office.
