5. **Welcome:** Mr. Wallace called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm.
6. **Quick recap**
  - a. This meeting of the Security Commission focused on reviewing boat patrol operations, rulebook updates, and upcoming events including CSLOA Fireworks. The commission discussed boat patrol body cameras and violations. The Commission reviewed the new rulebook that had been approved and posted online, with Brent raising a question about personal floatation device requirements for children under 12, which currently is state law but needs board approval for the rule to align with state requirements. The commission addressed preparations for the CSLOA Fireworks event, discussing security measures including police officer presence, fencing options, and bracelet tracking systems, with agreement to reduce entrance points from four to two. They also covered buoy maintenance, ADA parking installation plans, and discussed concerns about excessive lighting from a nearby residence affecting lake visibility.

## **11. Staff Reports**

### **a. Director of Administration Report**

1. Mrs. Bay reported that decals are available for pickup but advised calling ahead due to high demand. Mrs. Bay noted that marinas are open daily, seasonal staff completed required training, and deputies worked approximately 150 hours in May. The discussion covered buoy conditions, and plans for installing a culvert followed by ADA parking in two weeks. The conversation ended with a discussion about improving the boat patrol body cameras, with suggestions to use lanyards or phone holders to secure the devices in cup holders.

## **12. Old Business**

### **a. Boat Patrol Camera Review**

1. Boat Patrol cameras were discussed during staff reports.

### **b. Buoy Numbering**

1. Mrs. Bay noted there were approximately 10 poor condition buoys that needed to be replaced on Sweetwater and once those are replaced, numbering of the buoys would be complete.

### **c. Budget Review**

1. Mrs. Bay led a budget review, confirming that the current five-year budget remains unchanged and will be submitted to the board after the July Commission meeting. The Commission discussed potential fund reallocation strategies. The discussion also covered boat dock protection.

### **d. Speed Hump Project Status Update**

1. The Commission discussed speed humps, previously approved by the board for installation on specific roads including Greywolf, Sunset, Eagle, Grizzly, and Hackberry.

### **e. CSLOA Ox Roast & Fireworks**

1. Mrs. Golias discussed ongoing efforts to secure fencing for an event, with Mr. Clancy working on locating fencing options including mesh alternatives. Mrs. Bay noted two deputies have confirmed attendance for the event, with hopes of securing two more. The discussion also covered bracelet distribution logistics, with plans to track numbers and distribute them at the silent auction booth, though there were some uncertainties about the bracelet tracking system. The commission agreed to use two entrances instead of four for the fireworks event and discussed options for temporary fencing, with a preference for reusable mesh fencing as a cost-effective alternative.

**f. ADA Parking**

1. ADA parking was discussed during staff reports.

**g. Green Rule Book**

1. Brent Keith, CSCD Boat Patrol, proposed change to align personal flotation device requirements with state law, which currently requires PFDs for children twelve and under rather than the current six-and-under rule.

- a.** Mrs. Vavul discussed a freeholder concern about lightening at their neighbor's house and questioned if there was anything that could be done from a security standpoint. There was discussion over the Town of Nashville light ordinance but not a Brown County ordinance.
